Amidst 200 acres of the most pristine property in Novi, we're on the cusp of a medical milestone. In July 2008, St. John Health will realize its vision of creating one of the nation's most technologically advanced and patient friendly hospitals – one that will be a model for new hospitals across the country.

We're proud and excited to bring you a new concept in health care: Providence Park Hospital. This 496,000 square-foot facility will accommodate 268 private patient rooms and incorporate advanced health care technology in an environment that anticipates change and offers patient-centered amenities adapted from the hospitality industry.

In addition to advanced inpatient and outpatient services, we'll offer a comprehensive Orthopedic Center, incorporating all musculoskeletal services and an Ambulatory Surgical Center. The \$22 million, 65,000 square-foot facility, funded completely by private physician investors, will offer orthopedics, podiatry, pain control, primary care sports medicine, therapy and orthotics/prosthetics in one location.

We'll also have a Neurosciences Institute and Ambulatory Surgical Center that includes specialties such as neurology, neurosurgery, the Craniofacial Institute for Reconstructive Surgery and the Michigan Ear Institute. Our world-renowned physicians and staff will perform sophisticated procedures such as cochlear implant surgery and endoscopic skull base surgery.

Patients will also continue receiving the very best in oncology care at the award-winning Assarian Cancer Center – our joint effort with the University of Michigan Health System. The center's advanced technology and innovative therapies that address physical, emotional and spiritual needs are among the reasons why Providence Park has been designated an Oncology Center of Excellence.

In addition to these specialized centers of medical excellence, Providence Park will also be a teaching hospital, establishing its own Medical Education and Patient Care Research Programs. Our board-certified or board-eligible practitioners will instruct and assist medical students, residents and fellows in their clinical training. The research program will concentrate on clinical trials with an emphasis on oncology and cardiology; biomedical research focusing on histology, molecular genetics and cell biology; and medical training using computerized simulators, anatomical models and virtual learning laboratories.

Providence Park will also operate under a lean medical structure, incorporating system-wide improvements that will allow increased patient responsiveness and quality of care while eliminating time-consuming or inefficient practices. This value-centered approach to patient care, combined with amenities that support our mission of healing, will enhance the total patient experience.

Built into the natural contours of the land, Providence Park Hospital will be located in a park-like setting, including a greensward, fitness trail, wetlands and easily navigable, scenic entryways. The hospital itself is designed to engage patients through soothing colors, natural lighting, warm interior design and panoramic views of the campus.

We will also be a full-service destination for patients and families who need to be near hospitalized loved ones with a Staybridge Suites extended-stay hotel. Health-related retail businesses, such as a fitness center, yoga studio and specialty grocer will also serve their needs as well as the surrounding community.

From innovative features that enhance the patient experience to state-of-the-art technologies, specially trained staff and education and research opportunities, Providence Park Hospital will be among the most advanced and complete destinations for good health. We look forward to serving the community's health care needs.



Comprehensive Care for Women and Newborns

The entire third floor of Providence Park Hospital will be a dedicated Women’s and Infants’ Health Center that will provide the most comprehensive health care for women and newborns. The center will include 27 private Labor/Delivery/Recovery/ Postpartum (LDRP) rooms with sleeping areas for spouses and families, a well-baby nursery, Special Care Nursery (SCN), gynecology unit and ante-partum and observation rooms.

Following childbirth, mothers are encouraged to stay with their baby in LDRP room with their family and are provided plenty of baby care education and support. Each mother is assigned to a single LDRP nurse, allowing for warm, personalized care. Great attention is paid to creating a quiet, peaceful atmosphere conducive to relaxing and celebrating new life. The floor also includes a family lounge and a well-baby nursery to allow for breaks.

Premature babies and full-term babies with minor problems such as jaundice are treated in the 15-bed SCN unit. Like the LDRP rooms, the SCN rooms also provide space for the mothers. The ante-partum unit is a place for women who experience pre-term labor, pregnancy loss and prenatal loss. Gynecological surgeries and classes on women’s health issues such as menopause are given in the gynecology unit.





World Renowned Pediatric Care

St. John Providence Park Hospital will feature a 10-bed Pediatric Unit and dedicated emergency service located in a highly secure area near the Emergency Department. The pediatric unit features a group of world-renowned physicians who not only perform general pediatrics, but also spinal, cranial, oral and maxillofacial, and other highly complex surgical procedures. A staff of pediatric intensivists also provides 24-hour care to intensive care patients. Every unit nurse is also trained in Pediatric Advanced Life Support.

Ever-mindful of the need to create an enhanced patient experience, all pediatric rooms are private, child-friendly with appropriately sized furniture, and can accommodate overnight visitors. The rooms are also acuity adaptable, in which services revolve around the patient without switching rooms or caregivers, no matter the “acuity” of their condition. To promote personalized care, Registered Nurses are assigned between two and four patients. The unit will also feature a playroom with a DVD library and video games, as well as a special infant security system, in which all children ages 8-under wear an electronically coded wrist band to ensure their safety.

Streamlined Trauma Care

Designed to function as a fully equipped tertiary center that is staffed to care for serious traumas, the Emergency Department at Providence Park Hospital will serve as a valuable regional resource.

It will feature 24-hour, in-house coverage by general surgeons and promptly available specialty care, such as orthopedics, neurosurgery, anesthesiology, emergency, radiology, internal medicine and critical care. In addition, it will have research and medical education programs as well as preventative and outreach programs. Initial patient volumes of 55,000 annual visits are expected to increase annually. Space is allotted to meet the anticipated future demand of 68,000 visits.

The department layout will facilitate efficient patient evaluation and treatment. Patients arriving by ambulance will be admitted to one of two trauma rooms. Ambulatory patients will be seen in one of three triage rooms. Patients will then be directed to a treatment area specific to their needs. Five specialized treatment areas – chest pain (eight rooms), pediatrics (four rooms), express care (five rooms), psychiatric exam (three rooms) and general exam (five rooms) – streamline patient flow.

Beyond function, hospital designers created a calming and aesthetically pleasing environment in the Emergency Department. Natural lighting, inviting materials and textures and comfortable waiting areas are designed to instill comfort and confidence in anxious patients and visitors.

Advanced Cardiac Care

Providence Park Hospital will provide patients with advanced heart and vascular care. Services will include cardiac catheterizations, implantation of pacemakers and defibrillators (ICDs), diagnostic electrophysiology studies, nuclear imaging, vascular interventions, stress testing and comprehensive programs for cardiac rehabilitation and prevention of cardiovascular disease.

As a member of the St. John Health Cardiovascular Network, the hospital is aligned with the open-heart surgery program at Providence Hospital in Southfield, which was named a Top 100 heart hospital six years in a row and, since 1996, has been consistently recognized as a Cardiac Center of Excellence by Blue Cross Blue Shield. Providence Park patients have access to many of the same fine physicians who helped Providence earn its Top 100 designation, and, by virtue of its location, to many other top-quality physicians in southeast Michigan.

In addition, patients will benefit from the research, clinical trials, and studies in such areas as hypertension, congestive heart failure, acute coronary syndrome, acute myocardial infarction and carotid artery stents.

Comprehensive Orthopedic Care in One Setting

The new Novi Orthopedic Center at Providence Park Hospital will be a one-of-a-kind facility with a wide range of physician specialists, including orthopedic surgeons, podiatrists, pain management specialists and primary care physicians. Additional services will include physical therapy, orthotics and prosthetics, thus providing for one-stop musculoskeletal care.

The Center will also house the Novi Bone and Joint Surgery Center. Outpatient procedures performed here will include orthopedic, hand and wrist, ankle, knee, and podiatric surgeries. A team of pain management specialists will also perform procedures for neck, back and leg pain. Patients will not require hospital admission, but will have all of the benefits of care one would receive within a hospital setting.

The facility itself is designed to meet the needs and abilities of the least or most mobile patients. Handicap accommodations, parking spaces and elevators exceed local municipality requirements, and hallways are designed to eliminate the need to walk long distances.

Funded predominantly by private physician investors, the \$22 million, 65,000 square-foot facility represents a substantial commitment to their patients, practices and the community.

The Latest Advancements in Digital Imaging

To provide patients with the latest in advanced technology, St. John Providence Park Hospital is investing \$9 million in new, state-of-the-art digital imaging equipment. Located on the first floor of the new hospital adjacent to the Emergency Department, Imaging Services will also facilitate patient flow by assigning distinct equipment and staff to inpatient and outpatient groups.

Among the advanced imaging equipment is a cutting-edge SPECT/CT device, which combines nuclear medicine with computed tomography to provide radiologists with highly detailed, accurate imagery. A high field strength MRI machine has twice the magnetic power of conventional equipment, allowing a faster scan and providing greater image detail. The 64-slice CT scanner can scan the entire body in less than 60 seconds and perform a coronary scan in a little over a second, allowing for swift evaluation of chest pain and ruling out of heart attack, pulmonary embolism or cardiac disease. Digital mammography equipment allows better routine mammogram screenings for women under age 55. And because these digital machines are faster than earlier devices, there is a corresponding reduction in radiation doses, resulting in increased patient safety without sacrificing image quality.

Cancer care for body, mind, spirit

Building upon the innovative therapies and advanced technologies already available at the Michael and Rose Assarian Cancer Center, the St. John Providence Park campus promises to be a leading resource for the diagnosis and treatment of cancer. The Assarian Cancer Center, a Joint Venture between the University of Michigan and Providence, brings you:

- State-of-the-art treatment guidelines developed by the National Comprehensive Cancer Network, an alliance of 18 premier cancer centers, including the University of Michigan
- Access numerous clinical trials, leading to advanced treatment options
- Collaboration on cancer treatments and initiatives to improve quality of life
- Education about cancer prevention, diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation

Cancer care at St. John Providence Park promotes healing on all levels, physical, emotional and spiritual. Clinical expertise and state-of-the-art technologies address the patient's physical needs, while special features of the Center, such as the Reflection Space and Soulscape, promote peace and serenity. The Center for the Healing Arts provides resources to help patients work through the emotions surrounding a diagnosis of cancer and heal the mind and spirit - art and pottery classes, music therapy, journaling, meditation, massage, yoga, support groups and more.



Coordinated Care in a Single Facility

The Neurosciences Institute at Providence Park Hospital will include teams of highly accomplished neurosurgeons, neurologists, spine specialists, craniofacial and reconstructive surgeons, specialists in pain management, rehabilitation and pediatric neurologists.

The internationally renowned physicians of The Michigan Ear Institute, Michigan Head and Spine Institute, Michigan Spine and Brain Surgeons and Associates in Neurology will offer their comprehensive services. Providence Park Hospital will have dedicated operating rooms for neurosciences adjacent to an intra-operative MRI suite – the first of its kind in the region.

The Institute will also include an educational component. Specialists will teach simulated cranial, spine, skull base endovascular and other surgeries at a state-of-the-art Surgical Skills Lab. Nursing and anesthesia students can also take advantage of training opportunities in the simulated operating room. A separate, 60-seat lecture facility will be used for patient and community education classes.

Patients treated at the institute will receive a full spectrum of coordinated care from a team of leaders in their respective fields. Treatment is not solely confined to the hospital bed or operating room. Rather, the totality of each patient's physical, psychological and social needs is met, from the initial visit through rehab to discharge.

"The Institute will be Michigan's only coordinated care neuroscience program, where patients can see multiple physicians in related specialties at one facility. Besides our multidisciplinary approach to health care, we also have a dedicated neurosurgery intensive care unit with full-time intensivists coverage. You won't find that level of care at other hospitals."

Single-Room Convenience

St. John Providence Park Hospital will be a leader in offering the acuity adaptable patient care model, which allows the patient the convenience of remaining in one room, cared for by the same team of specially trained staff, throughout their entire stay. About 75 percent of the private patient rooms will provide this new standard in which the caregiver comes to the patient, no matter the “acuity” of their condition. These rooms are larger than traditional patient rooms and equipped with a higher level of medical technology and equipment. The nursing staff is also trained to care for patients with different diagnoses and severity of illness. The acuity adaptable model is yet another way St. John Providence Park is elevating the patient care experience.



Partnering for Advanced Patient Care

Through an agreement with General Electric Healthcare, a pioneer and technological leader in digital imaging, St. John Providence Park Hospital's Imaging Services will have access to the very latest in digital imaging equipment. The intent of the agreement is a partnership that focuses on improving patient safety. The agreement will not only provide St. John Providence with the latest GE patient imaging devices, but also continual hardware and software updates. In turn, St. John Providence Park will act as a "showcase" site for General Electric clients, so that visitors can see product use in a full health care campus experience. 
